By the end of this unit children will...

Throughout this unit, children will gain a curiosity and fascination about looking at the community where they live - namely Birmingham. By providing children with opportunities to investigate and make enquiries about their local area, they will have the opportunity develop a real sense of who they are, their heritage and what makes our local area unique and special. Children will understand geographical similarities and differences through the study of both human and physical Geography. We aim for the children to understand the importance of sustainable development and how human activity can impact our local environment.

Core Subjects

English

Descriptive writing - The Promise by Nicola Davies

This unit focusses on an environmental fable based in a city. Children explore the setting and use it to immerse themselves in the story.

- Proofread for spelling and punctuation errors
- Develop the use of inverted commas to correctly punctuate speech within extended writing
- Use first person and past tense through the role of a character
- place the possessive apostrophe accurately in words with regular plurals and in words with irregular plurals
- Predicting what might happen from details stated and implied
- Explore characters' thoughts and feeling in certain parts of the story

A Formal letter - Local Councillor

Children will write a formal letter to their local Councillor about a problem they have with the local environment.

Children will be able to:

- To know the features of a letter.
- To analyse a variety of letters and magpie words and phrases.
- Draft and write a letter correctly using paragraphs, expanded noun phrases, fronted adverbials and to show an understanding of synonyms.
- · Include empathy for the character.

Science

Sound

- identify how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating
- recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear
- find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it
- find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it
- recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases

Foundation Subjects

History and Geography

Geography - Local Geography - Birmingham

- Use a range of maps, atlases, images, globes and digital mapping to locate Birmingham and the surrounding area.
- Use compass directions and give directions to build knowledge of Birmingham within the United Kingdom and the wider world.
- Accurately use six figure grid references on an OS map to locate different landmarks and places of interest in Birmingham.
- Draw maps, sketches and plans with accurate symbols, keys and scale.
- Ask geographical questions about the place we live in Birmingham looking at both physical and human characteristics.
- Carry out investigations in our local area and explain opinions from a range of viewpoints.

Art and Design and Design Technology

Children will be focusing on the skills of drawing and printing in art this half term.

As they explore their local community and areas of great importance, they will make rubbings of different places in Erdington they have visited. This will then create the canvas on which they will sketch their place of most importance.

Skill: Drawing and Printing.

Music

Improvise and compose music for a range of purposes - writing raps about our community.

Children will continue their Brass instrument lessons.

Computing

Use sequence, selection and repetition in programmes; work with variables and various forms of input and output.

Core Subjects

Maths

- Compare numbers with the same number of decimal places up to two decimal places.
- Round decimals with one decimal place to the nearest whole number.
- Recognise and write decimal equivalents to \(\frac{1}{4}, \frac{1}{2} \) and \(\frac{3}{4} \).
- Read, write and convert time between analogue and digital 12and 24-hour clocks.
- Solve problems involving converting from hours to minutes; minutes to seconds; years to months; weeks to days.
- Analyse data
- Draw and analyse line charts

We will continue to focus on multiplication rapid recall up to 12 x12

RE

Easter

- Read and compare the four Gospels accounts of the Resurrection of Christ.
 - Understand the transforming effect this had upon the disciples.
 - Learn about the Ascension and explore how it reminds Christians of the promise of Christ that remains always with them.

Pentecost

- Know the story of Pentecost from the Acts of the Apostles.
- Understand that the gift of the Holy Spirit transformed the lives of the Apostles and enabled them to proclaim the Good News.
 - Identify the presence of the Holy Spirit in some of the Sacraments of the church.
