

Does truth speak to power? Year 6: Knowledge and Skills

Core Subjects

English

Year 6 will be preparing for their end-of-year production and will focus on spoken language. They will perform dress rehearsals to other pupils in school and a final performance at the Old Rep Theatre in Birmingham.

The pupils will be taught to:

- speak audibly and fluently with an increasing command of Standard English.
- participate in performances.
- gain, maintain and monitor the interest of the listener.
- select and use appropriate registers for effective communication.

Science

Light

Pupils will be taught to:

- recognise that light appears to travel in straight lines.
- use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain that objects are seen because they give out or reflect light into the eye.
- explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes.
- use the idea that light travels in straight lines to explain why shadows have the same shape as the objects that cast them.
