

We are pleased to share our results with you here.


The anti-bullying alliance defines bullying as, "The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face-to-face or online".

Our school does not tolerate instances of bullying. And it is clear from question 4 that our community agrees that any such instances are dealt with quickly and effectively. During **Friends Week 2022** pupils discussed the definition of bullying and developed their understanding of what bullying is and developed their understanding of the differences between bullying and a falling out with peers.

It is hard to mirror the exact work being taught at school at home as I am not aware of the precise subject matter being taught in subjects together with methods (maths). Although I have been shown the school website it isn't the easiest to understand. I would recommend termly parent workshops such as that of jolly phonic that was available in reception, so parents can easily support children throughout the year not just in phonics.

We welcome this feedback, this academic year school leaders chose to focus on our foundation curriculum and pupil well-being by inviting all parents to attend the Christmas Design & Technology workshops and our Family Week prayer services. It is always a fine balance between providing opportunities for parental engagement and also pressures of attendance on working parents. We look forward to announcing our 2023-24 workshops to families in the coming months.

Yes- I'd like to just say I'm finding it difficult as a working parent to come to the events that school put on. I'm very fortunate to have a flexible boss but there does seem to be a lot of term time events that parents are invited too and not all working parents have such flexible bosses. Also, I find it quite heart breaking for the children whose parents haven't made it to an event, (mainly the younger year groups) When they see parents and children sat there together and they cry, I find it really sad. Maybe if parents haven't been able to make an event, those children don't have to see those who's have. Just my recent feedback, you know I adore you guys and the Abbey.

As stated above school works tirelessly to get this right but the ideal offer for one family will not be the same for another.

Fantastic school. Teachers are very supportive and approachable. Good variety of after school activities that kids can try on. Happy and safe place for children to be. Consultation on planned trips/ costs ahead of the academic year would be good as these can be expensive given other financial commitments.

School recognise how difficult financial planning can be during the cost of living crisis. Behind the scenes we are working hard to reduce costs of trips and to book expensive trips like the Year 4, 5 and 6 residentials well in advanced. If you need any support, please speak to Mr McTernan.
